You can vote from Monday 13 November to 7pm, Saturday 25 November at voting places. Check **vote.nz** for the opening times and locations of voting places before you go. All voting places are open on election day, Saturday 25 November, from 9am to 7pm.

Working on election day?

You're legally allowed to have time away from work to go and vote on election day. You can also vote early at any voting place from Monday 13 November.

You can still vote if you are in a care home

If you are in a care home, you don't need to contact us. Your local Electorate Manager will contact the manager of your care home to arrange voting services.

You can still vote if you are in hospital

If you can't get to a voting place because you are in hospital, from Monday 13 November a friend or family member can bring you your voting papers. If you're scheduled to go into hospital prior to election day, it's best to vote in advance if you can, from Monday 13 November. Call us on **0800 36 76 56** for more information.



Your options if you are unable to get to a voting place

We provide voting services for people who can't get to a voting place. If you are unable to vote in person, for example, because of poor health or mobility, you can ask someone to bring you your voting papers or apply for voting papers to be sent to you.

Ask someone to collect your voting papers

If you are unable to go to a voting place, then complete and sign the attached form and ask someone to take it to a voting place for you. They will then bring you back your voting papers to complete.

If there's no one who can collect your voting papers on your behalf, we may be able to deliver them to you. Please call us on **0800 36 76 56**.

How to return your voting papers

You can:

Ask someone to drop your completed voting papers back to a voting place before 7pm, Saturday 25 November.

If you have a return courier pack, follow the instructions on the pack to arrange a courier pickup, otherwise call us on **0800 36 76 56** if you need help.
