

If you're Māori and 18 or over, you can choose to be on either the Māori roll or the general roll. Your roll determines who you can vote for to represent you and your rohe in Parliament.

The following steps will guide you through the process to make your choice for the 2026 General Election.

Are you currently enrolled to vote?

You are currently on either:
The **Māori roll**, or **general roll**

You can change rolls at anytime except in the three months before a parliamentary election or local election.

If you are eligible, **enrol now!**
Choose your roll at the same time.

Ways to enrol or change rolls:

- Go to vote.nz/enrol with your NZ driver licence, NZ passport, or RealMe verified identity, to enrol or update your details OR
- Call us free on **0800 36 76 56** and ask for an enrolment form to be emailed or posted to you OR
- Text your name and address for free to **3676** and we'll send you an enrolment form OR
- Go to vote.nz and download a blank enrolment form

Complete the form, choose the roll you want to be on, sign, date and return the form to us.
